**Justice matters**

But some irresponsible UK-listed companies are behaving as if it doesn't. The government needs to update the law so big companies can be prosecuted if they cause serious harm abroad. For example: a copper smelting plant in Zambia owned by a UK listed company is polluting the atmosphere to such an extent that some local children struggle to breathe. There are several gaps in UK law which makes it very hard to prosecute this kind of case. In particular, most UK laws only cover actions that take place in the UK, despite the international nature of business today.

**Hiroshima/ Nagasaki memorial fast**

Together with other groups around the world, an international group of people will be fasting in central London, sleeping in Westminster Quaker meeting house from Sat 6<sup>th</sup> August: the day a bomb was dropped on Hiroshima to Tues 9<sup>th</sup> August: the day a bomb was dropped on Nagasaki. They would be really happy if you could join them, either for the whole fast, for a day, or for a few hours. If you are unable to fast for medical reasons, you can come and support them by singing, handing out leaflets to passers-by to explain the reason for the fast.
